Update on the roundabout project

Here is the latest update from Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency on the Mt Iron junction roundabout.

While not fully completed, the roundabout should be ready to use over the busy Christmas and New Year holidays. The expected full project completion date is April 2024. Thank you for your patience and following the directions of work site crews. This will go a long way to achieving what everyone wants, and that is getting this job completed quickly and efficiently and keeping project crews, road users, and nearby residents safe.



The McDonald's Situation

It's not just Santa who is coming to town. The prospect of a McDonald's coming to Wānaka is a polarising topic. ATCA has only had one resident approach us on the matter, however, the opinion of the ATCA committee is that if the business complies with QLDC regulations, then we have no grounds to object as a community. We understand that residents can make submissions at the consent stage of the process. This is an issue that will no doubt cause some lively debate. Some people can't wait for McDonald's to open, while others are appalled at the thought of it. It will always come down to personal choice.

Noise issues

While we all love the arrival of long summer nights and barbecue season, one aspect of summer is not as welcome. Thumping, loud music played late into the night—sometimes on weeknights—is not appreciated by anyone. Lagoon and Ash Avenue residents have endured many sleepless nights lately.
